


Unaffiliated Program by Petition (UPP)

This form is mandatory for students who list an Unaffiliated Program by Petition (UPP) as a program choice in their DU Study Abroad Nomination Application. You must upload a completed petition into DU Passport by the specified deadline for each UPP on your program list.

Only *complete* petitions will be passed on to the INTZ Council for review.



A complete UPP Petition is ONE document with the following four parts (all included in this document).

Part 1 Student & Program Information

- Incl. proof of transcript

Part 2 Student Academic Plan

Part 3 Academic/Faculty Advisor Approval

- Needs academic/faculty advisor signature

Part 4 Study Abroad Cost Planning Worksheet

Part 5 UPP Petition Essay Responses for the UPP Program choice

Upload Instructions

Petitions must be **correctly** uploaded to the Study Abroad Nomination Application per the following guidelines:

1. Complete the form digitally & save all pages into ONE document. Save the document as:
Last Name – UPP Petition (Ex: Smith – UPP Petition)
2. Login to your Study Abroad Nomination Application in DU Passport.
3. Find the *Attached Documents* panel on the left side of your checklist.
4. Click *Choose File* and choose your saved file.
5. From the *Select Document* drop-down menu, choose **UPP Petition**.
6. Click *Upload*.
7. You should see your attached file in the panel above.

If you incorrectly upload a file, contact the OIE to have the incorrect version removed.

Petitions are granted in limited cases for students who are able to successfully demonstrate all of the following.

Please ensure that your petition meets the following requirements:

- Presents a clear academic plan for how this program will play an integral role in enhancing your overall academic goals at DU.
- Includes a comparative side-by-side study of DUPPs and AUPs in relation to this program. You must demonstrate a unique academic need not currently available in the DPPP or AUP portfolio. (location is not a unique academic need)
- Demonstrates your program...
 - provides high academic integrity and provides a transcript from an accredited institution.
 - meets reasonable standards for health and safety (including the location)
 - provides you with adequate support before and on site.
 - has the backing of the student's academic department, which must sign off on the student's academic plan and program choice.

This form is intended as an estimate of costs for the student's planning benefit and may differ from actual costs spent; the OIE is not responsible for verifying the costs indicated by the student below.

Step 1: Financial Aid - How much financial aid you'll receive

Students on an AUP or UPP can use federal and state aid. **DU aid does not apply.** If you plan to use financial aid and/or scholarships you should contact Financial Aid and/or your scholarship provider directly to discuss if study abroad on an unaffiliated program will change your award. 1. Discuss your academic goals and highlight the ways in which you feel your academics will be enriched through international study. How will this particular study abroad program contribute to your goals, build upon your education to date and connect to your studies when you return to campus? Please describe the classes you plan to take abroad and how the academic focus of this program relates to your major, minor, and/ or demonstrated academic interests.

2. Please contrast your choice with each relevant DUPP and AUP option and explain why this program is a better fit for your academic goals than any of these options. (You are encouraged to discuss this question with your OIE Advisor if you are struggling to identify which relevant programs you should be contrasting here.) You must present a unique academic need. Location is not a valid criterion.

3. Will you be taking classes with local students or with other US or international students?

4. Who teaches the classes you propose to take? (Local university faculty? Faculty hired by a program provider?) Indicate the highest degree attained by the faculty members teaching the courses you hope to take.

5. How are students assessed? Describe the grading and credit system used by this program. Will you receive a transcript based upon a U.S. system of credits/grading or will it be a foreign system?


6. Will you be participating in any engaged learning opportunities (research, independent study, internship, service-learning etc) while on this program? If so, please provide a thorough description of the opportunity.

7. Is language study a formal part of the academic program? What opportunities exist outside the classroom for students to develop foreign language skills?

8. What kind of student support is provided as part of the program? Do they provide assistance for immigration needs (visas etc)? What type of orientation is provided? If you are participating in a program with a low level of student support, please describe in detail how you plan to independently navigate the program, as well as life in your host city/ country.

9. What are the main health and safety concerns for this country, and how does the program address these concerns? Is there currently a travel warning from the US State Department for this country/ location? What are the recommendations of International SOS? (You can find links to the State Department and ISOS [here](#) and [here](#))

10. What challenges might you face in study abroad that you have not already addressed in your previous essays? Consider your program selection(s) and aspects such as cultural differences, language barriers, level of program support, learning differences, finances, being away from home, etc. What skills and resources might you utilize to address these challenges? In answering this question, consider your comfort level in navigating issues independently and self-advocating while abroad. Your answer must also address how you are prepared to navigate an unaffiliated program with which DU has no formal affiliation, meaning that you will need to serve as the main conduit for researching and figuring out all program details, visa and immigration requirements, housing, class registration, etc.
