### Sex & Dating

- Machismo is less prevalent now than before but is still a part of everyday life, with catcalling and harassment
- Predominantly Roman Catholic, and urban areas / rural values can be quite different
- Communication typically involves indirectness, with limited personal space

### Alcohol & Drugs

- Legal age to buy/consume alcohol: 18
  - Drinking in public is legal in general
- Cannabis (marijuana) recreational and medicinal use is decriminalized in some areas
  - Taking steps towards legalization

### LGBTQIA+ Culture

- AR was the first country in Latin America to legalize same-sex marriages
- Comprehensive transgender rights laws
- Buenos Aires has many queer spaces

- Population: 46 million
- Currency: Argentine peso
- Official Language: Spanish
