Sex & Dating

- Machismo is less prevalent now than before
 - Catcalling and harassment are illegal in certain areas, though still exist
- Still a predominantly Roman Catholic country, and rural areas can be quite different to urban
- Communication typically involves quite a bit of indirectness, with limited personal space

Alcohol & Drugs

- Legal age to buy/consume alcohol: 18
 - Drinking in public is illegal
- Cannabis (marijuana) recreational use is decriminalized for personal use in some areas
 - Medicinal use permitted under conditions
 - Taking steps towards legalization, and is a common part of society

LGBTQIA+ Culture

- Chile has legalized same-sex marriages
- Legal protections for gender identity
- Santiago has many queer spaces, and multiple other cities throughout CL have queer scenes

Cultural Customs and Norms

- Population: 18 million
- Currency: Chilean peso
- Official Language: Spanish
 - Many know English
- "Usted" is expected in formal situations, with more communal situations utilizing "tú"

 - More respectful to greet the head of household first
