Sex & Dating

- High levels of gender equality in everyday life
- Catcalling & aggressive flirting less prevalent than U.S.
- Communication in dating is typically very direct

Alcohol & Drugs

- Legal age to buy/consume alcohol: 16 or 18
 - Dependent on type of alcohol/place purchased
 - Drinking in public is legal in general
- Cannabis (marijuana) recreational use is illegal
 - Medicinal use permitted under conditions
 - Currently moving towards legalization

LGBTQIA+ Culture

- DE is generally accepting & welcoming to LGBTQIA+
 - Especially in Berlin, home to many queer spaces
- Gender identity and expression typically more progressive in cities
 - Rural areas: more traditional stances

Cultural Customs and Norms

- Population: 83 million
- Currency: Euro
- Official Language: German
 - Many Germans also know English
- Greetings are formal, titles are important
 - Always use formal language when meeting someone for the first time (ex. Herr/Frau)
 - Common to shake hands with every person
- Germans are environmentally conscious
- More open attitude towards public nudity (ex. saunas)
