Denmark (DK)

Sex & Dating

- Open and tolerant attitude toward gender norms, expression of gender
 - Less restrictive binary gender norms
- Communication in dating is typically very direct
 - Very common to split the bill!
- Sex is not considered to be a taboo topic

Alcohol & Drugs

- Legal age to buy/consume alcohol: 16 or 18
 - Dependent on type of alcohol/place purchased
 - Drinking in public is legal in general
- Cannabis (marijuana) recreational use is illegal
 - Possession of cannabis is illegal
 - Medicinal use permitted under conditions

LGBTQIA+ Culture

- Denmark is one of the most queer-friendly countries in the world
 - First country to grant legal recognition to same-sex unions
 - Safe and welcoming
- May experience a generational divide with older Danes not being accustomed to gender neutral pronouns

Cultural Customs and Norms

- Population: 5.6 million
- Currency: Danish krone
- Official Language: Danish
 - English is predominant second language
- Danes are generally considered friendly, but not sociable in public with strangers
- Denmark is very socially liberal, is very environmentally conscious
- Traffic laws and rules are strictly obeyed
- Denmark is majority homogenous, many people of color report experiences of feeling "othered" and that racism is ignored
