Ecuador (EC)

Sex & Dating

- Machismo is less prevalent now but is still a part of everyday life, catcalling & harassment
- Predominantly Roman Catholic country, and urban areas / rural can be quite different
- Communication typically involves indirectness, with limited personal space

Alcohol & Drugs

- Legal age to buy/consume alcohol: 18
 - Drinking in public is generally illegal in large cities
- Cannabis (marijuana) recreational use is generally illegal
 - Medicinal use is legal

LGBTQIA+ Culture

- EC has legalized same-sex marriages
 - Stigmatized in many areas, especially in regards to trans rights
- Quito and Guayaquil have queer spaces, but rural areas typically do not

Cultural Customs and Norms

- Population: 17 million
- Currency: USD
- Official Language: Spanish
 - Indigenous languages (such as Kichwa and Shuar) are utilized more predominantly in rural areas
- "Usted" is expected in formal situations, communal situations use "tú"
- Common to greet others with a cheek kiss
