

# **Back-to-Back Programs**

#### Overview

At the University of Denver, the best way to study abroad for an academic year is to apply for an exchange program, which is by definition for the duration of an academic year. Please review the <u>yearlong exchange programs</u> before completing this petition. There are limited spots for students wishing to do a (non-exchange) yearlong program or back-to-back Study Abroad programs (DUPP | AUP | UPP). Therefore, there is a petition process for students who would like to do back-to-back programs. In order to have your petition considered, read and carefully follow the directions below.

#### Considerations

- **Know your responsibilities.** Students who choose to do back-to-back programs are responsible for all immigration & logistics research, and any additional costs associated with this choice.
- Consider Logistics. Research additional costs, documentation, regulations, etc. that you may encounter. Make sure to think through sure all possible program options/combinations. Can you apply for your 2<sup>nd</sup>-term visa while abroad or do you need to return to the US? How long does visa processing generally take for your 2<sup>nd</sup>-term program option? Does it work better if you change your fall option to spring and vice versa?
- Meet with an OIE advisor early. We recommend discussing important considerations & how the process works early in the process, even if you're unsure whether you'll apply.

### Research & Complete the Petition

- Students considering back-to-back study abroad programs are encouraged to meet with an OIE advisor prior to completing this petition.
- For consideration, petitions must be uploaded to the Study Abroad Nomination Application by the <u>OIE Deadline</u> (January 15, 2022 for AY 2022-23). Late petitions will not be accepted.
- In your DU Study Abroad Nomination Application, select your program choice(s) (in order of preference) to reflect your wishes if granted only a single term abroad. In this petition, include your desired second term abroad program(s) (in order of preference) if granted a B2B spot.
- Students may interview with the OIE Director after the OIE Standard Deadline.
- Students will be scored on the quality of their petition, as well as their interview, and will be considered for a back-to-back program spot based on their score as it compares to others. Students not initially granted a back-to back program spot may be placed on a wait list in case additional spots later become available.

#### Submit the Petition

- **Upload this form before you submit!** You must complete ALL application steps (incl. uploading this form) before you hit submit in DU Passport, even if you choose the early deadline.
- **Upload your petition correctly.** Follow these upload instructions to ensure your form is correctly uploaded to DU Passport & remains eligible for consideration.
- **Additional essays:** If awarded a back-to-back programs spot, you'll get 48 hours to complete additional program essays for your 2<sup>nd</sup>-term program choice in DU Passport (if needed).
