Process & Instructions



Research Programs

- Determine which programs are the best fit for you.
- **Consider an exchange program first.** Exchange programs are the only guaranteed way to study abroad for the entire academic year, as they are designed to be longer than a standard quarter/semester program. Review available exchange programs before looking into other yearlong options. These programs do not require a petition.
- Yearlong options are limited for DUPPs. Aside from our exchange programs, DU may have limited spots for yearlong study abroad on DU Partner Programs. Students can submit either...
 - Yearlong Petition: Request to extend one quarter- or semester-long DUPP to a full academic year.
 - Back-to-Back Form: Two different programs (DUPP | AUP | UPP) representing a full academic year.
- Make sure your program offers a yearlong option. This option is not available for all programs. Look under *Dates & Deadlines* on the program brochure for Academic Year (by petition).

Research Yearlong Process & Meet with OIE Advisor

- Meet with an OIE advisor early. We recommend discussing important considerations & how the process works early in the process, even if you're unsure whether you'll actually submit a petition.
- Learn how the petition process works below. Follow all instructions carefully to ensure your petition is considered.

Complete Yearlong Petition

• **Upload your petition correctly.** Follow the instructions below to ensure your petition is correctly uploaded to DU Passport & remains eligible for consideration.

Submit Entire DU Passport Application on Time

- Upload your petition before you submit!
 - The OIE prioritizes on-time petitions.
 - You must complete ALL application steps (incl. uploading your petition)
 before you hit submit in DU Passport for your petition to be considered "ontime"— even if you choose the early deadline.
 - You must submit your entire application by the <u>petition deadline</u> (Jan 15, 2022) for your petition to be considered "on-time."
- Late petitions are accepted until the wait-list deadline. The OIE reviews late petitions in the order received. Students who submit before the petition deadline will be higher on the wait-list.

Complete Additional Steps After You Submit

• Interview with the OIE Director: Students who submit complete petitions may be asked to interview with the OIE Director after the standard deadline. Late submissions will not include a director interview.

How Scoring Works

Students will be scored on the quality of their petition, as well as their interview, and will be considered for a yearlong program spot based on their score as it compares to others. Students not granted a yearlong program spot may remain on the waitlist in case additional spots later become available.
