

# Study Abroad Cost Planning Worksheet

## UNAFFILIATED PROGRAMS (AUP/UPP)



This worksheet is designed to help students understand the total cost for study abroad on an unaffiliated program (AUP/UPP). For assistance with this sheet, please meet with an OIE advisor.

### STEP 1: Financial Aid – How much financial aid will you receive?

Students on unaffiliated programs can only use federal and state aid. **DU aid does not apply.** If you plan to use financial aid and/or scholarships, you should contact Financial Aid and/or your scholarship provider directly to discuss if study abroad on an unaffiliated program will impact your award amount. ### STEP 2: Estimate Your Cost Abroad – How much will study abroad cost?

- A. Determine how much DU will charge you per quarter for participation on an unaffiliated program. (Academic year students will pay for 3 quarters of DU tuition and fees).

The DU Bursar's Office will issue a bill for this amount on the University's tuition billing date. Please note that these amounts are contingent on the Bursar's Office and are subject to change each year.
