## DU PARTNER PROGRAMS (DUPP)



This worksheet is designed to help students understand the total cost for study abroad on a DU Partner Program. For assistance with this sheet, please meet with an OIE advisor.

### STEP 1: Financial Aid – How much financial aid will you receive?

Students on DU Partner Programs should include federal, state, and DU aid (including housing grants). If you plan to use financial aid and/or scholarships, you should contact the Financial Aid Office and/or your scholarship provider directly to discuss if study abroad will change your award. ### STEP 2: Estimate Your Cost Abroad – How much will study abroad cost?

- Determine if you qualify to be a Cherrington Global Scholar (CGS). For CGS eligibility requirements, please see [du.edu/abroad/costs/cherrington](http://du.edu/abroad/costs/cherrington)
- Determine how much DU will charge you per quarter. (Academic year students will pay for 3 quarters of DU tuition and fees).

The DU Bursar's Office will issue a bill for this amount on the University's tuition billing date. Please note that these amounts are contingent on the Bursar's Office and Housing and Residential Education (HRE) and are subject to change each year.
