

DU Global Fellows Program

The DU Global Fellows training and mentorship program helps study abroad returnees to build on their experiences abroad and incorporate those experiences into their academic, personal, and professional lives. Fellows join a select group of peers to engage in reflection around their time abroad, take on leadership roles, and build skills in diverse areas such as intercultural competence, responsible global citizenship, marketing, communications, social media, event planning, and program management. Additionally, Fellows work closely with OIE mentors to develop personalized goal plans, allowing Fellows to customize the program and its outcomes to the Fellow's own interests and desired areas for growth. Through the program, Global Fellows develop their own skills as responsible global citizens, while helping to shape study abroad and intercultural learning at DU.

Primary Program Components*:

- ❖ Participation in 2 workshops (1 winter quarter & 1 spring quarter - food provided!)
- ❖ A leadership role in one event of your choosing:
 - The Global Reveal
 - INTZ Summit
 - Day of Action
 - "Fish Out of Water" Storytelling Event
 - Your own project proposal!
- ❖ Participation and support of at least one other Global Fellow event
- ❖ Development and implementation of a personal goal plan
- ❖ Bi-quarterly meetings with an OIE mentor
- ❖ [Intercultural Development Inventory](#) & Intercultural Development Plan (IDP)
- ❖ Manage and contribute to Regional Facebook Groups

*Participation in the above program components is mandatory for successful completion of the program.

- ❖ Present and share on your study abroad experience
- ❖ Participation in regional pre-departure orientation sessions
- ❖ DU Passport Program Review

Global Fellows should be prepared to commit to 10-20 hours per quarter for both winter and spring quarters (minimum 30-40 hours total time commitment).

In addition to the mentorship and skills development offered through the program, Fellows who successfully complete all program components will receive a certificate of completion, Linked in/ letters of recommendation, and an invitation to participate as Senior Fellows the following year.
